

**MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING
MASSILLON CITY COUNCIL
HELD, MONDAY, OCTOBER 5, 2015**

COUNCIL PRESIDENT TOWNSEND – Welcome to the Massillon City Council Meeting for Monday, September 21, 2015. We have in attendance with us the following city officials: Mayor Kathy Catazaro-Perry, Service Director, Joel Smith, Auditor, Jayne Ferrero, Chief Deputy Auditor, Debbie Bonk, Bob Cyperski of the Law Dept., Community Development Director, Larry Marcus and Police Chief, Keith Moser. On the wall to your left are agendas for anyone who wishes to follow tonight's meeting. Also if you look at the agenda, under item #5 is where the public can speak on any item that appears on tonight's agenda and then under item #17 is where the public can speak on any item that does NOT appear on tonight's agenda. COUNCIL PRESIDENT TOWNSEND – Thank you, Madam Clerk. I need a motion to excuse Councilwoman Del Rio-Keller. Motioned by Mr. Manson, seconded by Councilman Chovan. Roll call to excuse Councilwoman Del Rio-Keller.

6. INTRODUCTION OF ORDINANCES AND RESOLUTIONS

ORDINANCE NO. 144 – 2015

BY: ENVIRONMENTAL COMMITTEE

AN ORDINANCE authorizing the Director of Public Service and Safety of the City of Massillon, Ohio, to advertise for and receive sealed bids and enter into a contract, upon award and approval of the Board of Control, with the lowest and best bidder for the Wastewater Treatment Plant Fiber Cable Project, and declaring an emergency.

COUNCIL PRESIDENT TOWNSEND – Councilwoman Starrett.

COUNCILWOMAN STARRETT – Thank you, Mr. President. This ordinance deals with a fiber optic cable line that we would like to place between the Wastewater Treatment Plant and the Administrative buildings downtown. This would provide mutual backup for off-site backup for each of these sites. At this point, this project will cost about \$105,000 with Stark County providing 50% of that cost and the other 50% would be coming out of Wastewater Treatment Capital Fund. Is there any questions or discussion on this at this point? Seeing none at this point, I make a motion that we suspend the rules requiring three separate readings and bring Ord. No. 144 – 2015 forward for a vote.

COUNCIL PRESIDENT TOWNSEND – Councilman Stinson.

COUNCILMAN STINSON – Thank you, Mr. President. This is an annual thing that we do to insure our vehicles; police, fire and also other City vehicles and there is a timeline on it which we need to get this passed. AN ORDINANCE making certain transfers in the 2015 appropriations from within the 1201 Street Construction Fund and the 1100 General Fund, for the year ending December 31, 2015, and declaring an emergency.

COUNCIL PRESIDENT TOWNSEND – Councilman Lewis.

COUNCILMAN LEWIS – Yes. Could I call the Auditor?

COUNCIL PRESIDENT TOWNSEND – Sure.

JAYNE FERRERO – Mr. President, member of Council, Mr. Lewis.

COUNCILMAN LEWIS – Yes. Just because there's some movement, could you give us a quick summary?

JAYNE FERRERO – What we're doing on the first part is we're taking money out of the Safety salary line and their Hosp/Eye/Dental and we're putting it into the Street Dept. to fulfill their \$34,000 and also their Eye and Hosp line for \$6,700. It amounts to \$40,700. The next one is we're taking from various places. We're taking salary from the Law Dept., disability, pension transfer, real property tax, state exam and refunds for \$39,150 and we're filling line items that we are going around "scrubbing" all of these accounts and making sure we have enough until year end. Domestic violence, salary, PERS, Medicare, Engineer, also the janitor, he needs Hosp/Eye/Dental. PERS for City Hall, public building. Salary for Building, Hosp/Eye/Life for Building. PERS for Building, Medicare for Building. Hosp/Eye/Dental for Street, PERS for Street and Hosp/Eye/Dental for Health for \$39,150.

COUNCILMAN LEWIS – Madam Auditor, this is, just for record, typical corrections or adjustments that we make every year to make sure that we "zero" balance at the end of the year.

JAYNE FERRERO – That's right. So we have enough to fulfill all of their obligations. Somehow, it wasn't calculated exactly correctly, so we balance that out every year about this time to make sure that it all balances by year end.

COUNCILMAN LEWIS – Thank you. Any other questions or comments. Seeing none, I make a motion that we suspend the rules requiring three readings bringing Ord. No. 155 – 2015 forward for a vote.

COUNCIL PRESIDENT TOWNSEND – Thank you. Seconded by Councilwoman Scassa. Roll call for suspension.

As discussed by the Director of Parks & Recreation at the last meeting, these transfers are being made to assure her that she's able to make it through the end of the year conducting business as she is doing now and fulfilling whatever obligations she foresees coming up in the next couple of months. So, this was a piece that we all kind of missed.
